Every sentence has two parts: a subject and a predicate.

Emily Dickinson wrote poetry.

subject:: who predicate: did what

The **subject** part of a sentence names <u>whom</u> or <u>what</u> the sentence is about.

The **predicate** part of the sentence tells what the subject <u>does</u> or <u>has</u>. I can also describe what the subject <u>is</u> or <u>is like</u>.

**A sentence must have both a subject and a predicate. It must also express a complete thought.

A sentence fragment does not express a complete thought. It may also be missing a subject, a predicate, or both.

Correcting Sentence Fragments

<u>Fragment</u>	<u>Problem</u>	<u>Sentence</u>	
Her sister.	Lacks a predicate— What did her sister do?	Her sister discovered the poems in her bureau.	
Wrote about her emotions.	Lacks a subject— Who wrote about her emotions?	This gifted poet wrote about her emotions.	
Of meaning.	This fragment lacks a both subject and predicate.	Her poems contain many layers of meaning.
